HOW TO LISTEN TO A SERMON

LISTEN FOR THE GOSPEL!

The number one thing to listen for in a sermon is the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ. How is the Gospel being proclaimed? What has God done for you? How does it apply to you? Do you believe what is being proclaimed to you? The Gospel is what creates and strengthens your faith. Be sure to listen for, identify, and apply the Gospel to your own life! The Gospel creates and strengthens your faith!

Whoever believes and holds to Christ's Word, heaven stands open to him, hell is shut, the devil is imprisoned, sins are forgiven, and he is a child of eternal life. That is what this book teaches you -- the Holy Scripture -- and no other book on earth. *Martin Luther (WA 48:155)*

Giving to the Lord

One of the greatest joys of the Christian faith and life is giving your tithes and offerings to the Lord. This may seem really strange to you if this is new to you. Our natural inclination is to be very guarded with our money. But yet in faith, we realize that everything we are and everything we have is a gift from God's good hand, including our money. Giving of your tithes and offerings reflects that faith, as you support the work of Christ in our congregation.

There is true joy in giving to the Lord!

Pledge Card Sunday will be Sunday, Dec. 1st. Our custom here at Trinity is to ask you to fill out a pledge card, (after prayer, thought, and planning), & bring it up front as a confession of faith. No one here at Trinity opens that pledge card; rather we will mail it back to you unopened in six months. This is a devotional exercise to help you keep the Lord first, and have a Godly perspective on your money.

ALL SAINTS DAY

We will be celebrating "All Saints Day" on Sunday, Nov. 3. The word "saint" is from the Latin word sanctus and means "holy". The Bible teaches us that a "saint" is one "set apart (holy)" through faith in Jesus Christ (see 2 Timothy 1:9). In faith, we all are "saints"! [There is no such thing as the Roman Catholic idea of "sainthood" where someone has more good works than they need to enter heaven and you can pray to them to help you.] On All Saints Day, we will remember our fellow brothers and sisters who have died this past year here at Trinity.

BEWARE: Fraud Alert

From Pastor Bolte: "I am working with a family of our congregation to warn everyone NOT to give money, gift cards, etc. to anyone who asks you, even if they are a member of the congregation. If someone approaches you and asks for money, please call Pastor Bolte (623.694.2685) to make sure it is not a part of this fraud and scam situation."

Understanding the Absolution

Sometimes visitors in a Lutheran service of worship are surprised to hear in the general confession and absolution our pastors saying: "Upon this your confession, I, as a called and ordained servant of the Word, announce the grace of God to all of you and in the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." Our Lutheran Confessions help us to understand why our pastors speak this way: "It is not the voice or word of the man who speaks it, but it is the Word of God, who forgives sin, for it is spoken in God's stead and by God's command" (AC XXV.3). Absolution is the Lord's life-giving, sure and certain word that does for us what no surgery, medicine, therapy, counseling, or advice can do for us. The Lord's Word of Absolution doesn't cover up or hide our sin. Nor does it give us only a temporary relief that soon fades away. Our Lord's word of absolution reconciles us to God the Holy Trinity.
