Everything is going well here! The Lord has blessed my time with the students! I sent two pictures, the first is the congregation in Saura, a remote village outside Yambio. They send their greetings to all of you! The second picture is at Bishop Peter Anibati's pineapple farm outside of town. The students here are very grateful for your love and



support; repeatedly, and with sincere appreciation, they thank you for investing in their theological education. It's amazing to see such deep faith in one of the poorest and dangerous parts of the world. Please remember them in your prayers as they continue to study God's Holy Word. (Also remember one of the students, Martin, who has both typhoid and malaria and is struggling. As a congregation we were able to help him get the appropriate medicine in the market. Also an update: Nhial, the student airlifted to the Juba hospital is recovering! However, it does not sound like he will be returning to the seminary. On any given day here, at least a third of the students are ill, most with malaria.). I will be back next weekend, and I have created a prayer sheet for you with the student's name, picture, and family information.

Understanding the Absolution

Sometimes visitors in a Lutheran service of worship are surprised to hear in the general confession and absolution our pastors saying: "Upon this your confession, I, as a called and ordained servant of the Word, announce the grace of God to all of you and in the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."

Our Lutheran Confessions help us to understand why our pastors speak this way: "It is not the voice or word of the man who speaks it, but it is the Word of God, who forgives sin, for it is spoken in God's stead and by God's command" (AC XXV.3).

Absolution is the Lord's life-giving, sure and certain word that does for us what no surgery, medicine, therapy, counseling, or advice can do for us. The Lord's Word of Absolution doesn't cover up or hide our sin. Nor does it give us only a temporary relief that soon fades away. Our Lord's word of absolution reconciles us to God the Holy Trinity.

Why go to the Lord's Supper?

But those who are mindful of their weakness desire to be rid of it and long for help. They should regard and use the Sacrament just like a precious antidote against the poison that they have in them. Here in the Sacrament you are to receive from the lips of Christ forgiveness of sin. It contains and brings with it God's grace and the Spirit with all His gifts, protection, shelter, and power against death and the devil and all misfortune. So you have, from God, both the command and the promise of the Lord Jesus Christ. Besides this, from yourself, you have your own distress, which is around your neck. Because of your distress this command, invitation, and promise are given. This ought to move you. For Christ Himself says, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick" [Matthew 9:12]. In other words, He means those who are weary and heavy-laden with their sins, with the fear of death, temptations of the flesh, and of the devil. If, therefore, you are heavy laden and feel your weakness, then go joyfully to this Sacrament and receive refreshment, comfort, and strength [Matthew 11:28].
